	Social/Cultural/Historical Context: Look at the historical, cultural, social, and/or political	
	implications of the theme you are analyzing. (Ex: the implications of abstinence-only sex education vs. comprehensive sexual education in regards to HIV/AIDS).	
	<b>Sources:</b> Support your arguments/claims/position AND make it relevant; i.e., not a stand-	
	alone quote that does not add credibility to your argument. (Ex: provide statistics that	
	support your claim OR/AND examples that are relevant to your topic/theme. Make sure to	
	also comment on or explain the relevance of examples/statistics provided).
